Angel is awarded a Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Award

Angel received a standing ovation when he was awarded his Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Award on Friday, May 15th at the Du Bois Center of Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona.

Since 1982, the Arizona Preservation Foundation and Arizona State Historic Preservation Office/Arizona State Parks have collaborated to present the Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Awards. These awards recognize people, organizations, and projects that represent outstanding achievements in preserving Arizona's prehistoric and historic resources.

The mission of the Governor's Heritage Preservation Honor Awards is to:

- Promote public awareness of historic preservation in the State of Arizona;
- Publicly recognize the varied contributions by volunteers, professionals, organizations, and agencies to promote the goals of historic preservation;
- Identify and recognize educational, community, non-profit, and private sector heritage projects that demonstrate excellence in design and execution.

2015 Awardees Included: Annual Tour of Historic Florence, Angel Delgadillo, Old Adobe Mission Rehabilitation Project, Yavapai County Courthouse Rehabilitation Project, Lauren Allsopp, Negrette House Rehabilitation Project, Fort Lowell Park Officers Quarters, University of Arizona Old Main Rehabilitation Project, Fort Verde State Historic Park Volunteer Program

Another Successful Fun Run

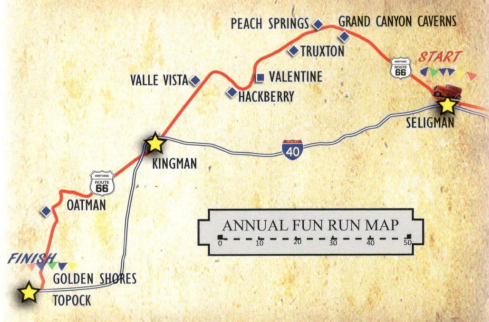
Thank you to all who contributed to make this year's 28th Annual Route 66 Fun Run a success. A total of 740 cars registered for this year's Fun Run, and fun they had!

The three day event hosted by the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona was held the first weekend of May as it is every year. The events held in Seligman on Friday evening included live music at the Snow Cap & the Black Cat; a silent auction with beer and wine tasting; a penny car show; a spaghetti dinner; and a cruisin' Route 66 parade. Then on Saturday morning in Seligman, Angel, as President Emeritus of the Association, started the parade of cars on their journey westward along the longest remaining stretch of Route 66 left in the country. The towns along the way; Grand Canyon Caverns, Peach Springs, Hackberry, Valle Vista, and Kingman; welcomed and entertained the travelers in their own special way on Saturday. In Kingman, the "Show-N-Shine" let participants show off their cars. The festivities continued on Sunday as the caravan left Kingman to explore the wild west of Cool Springs Station and Oatman. At the end of the drive, the town of Topock-Golden Shores hosted the Awards Ceremony and Farewell Reception.

Although not an official car show, 66 trophies are given to participants for such categories as "Best Plymouth", "Best Under Construction", "Best Antique Vehicle", "Best Paint", "Classiest Interior", "Best Motor" and 60 others! 2015 Fun Run Poker Chips for Sale

The Seligman Historical Society is selling special edition 2015 Route 66 Fun Run Poker Chips. These commemorative chips are numbered 1-500 and are on sale for \$10 each.

Proceeds from the sale of the poker chips will go to help restore the Cottage Hotel here in Seligman. The Cottage Hotel, built in 1912, is one of the oldest buildings in Seligman. Located just one block north of Route 66, the Cottage Hotel is a registered historic building and the only building in town owned by a Seligman entity; the non-profit Seligman Historical Society. It was first built as a rooming house for railway workers and cowboys and later used as a birthing place for expectant mothers. In recent years, the Cottage Hotel has been serving as a museum open to the public on only a few select days of the year. The Historical Society is in the process of raising money to restore the building in order to act as Seligman's full time visitor's center and museum. Plans include not only restoring the Cottage Hotel under the guidelines for historic buildings, but also landscaping and adding modernized outbuildings on the adjacent lot.
